Welcome to Our 2017 Year in Review

From the Board Chair

Dear Friends of Cascadia,

Every day I am continuously amazed by the breadth and depth of our accomplishments at Cascadia Art Museum.

More than 10,000 visitors came through our doors in 2017. 825 people are currently active members. 65 volunteers give countless hours. Thirteen board members meet regularly to develop policy, provide oversight and raise funds and awareness. Our staff of four navigates a chockfull calendar of activity and events. Brimming with one-of-a-kind gifts, artwork and jewelry, our museum store constantly bustles with volunteers and patrons.



In 2017 we presented seven exhibitions in our five galleries, built four new public programs, published our first book and launched an audio guided tour program. We forged new and strengthened existing partnerships and secured major new funding. We hosted our second anniversary gala and balanced our budget.

It has been a great year.

I want to take this moment to reflect on the tremendous accomplishments of 2017 and say thank you to the donors and volunteers whose tireless efforts and generosity have brought us this far.

Consulting curator David F. Martin is a walking font of knowledge. His infinite curio-






THE KIDS ARE ALRIGHT:

Cascadia Explores the Role of Art in Writing for School-Age Kids

A group of antsy first-graders are sitting on the carpet. They are from Martha Lake Elementary and they would all rather be running around outside than sitting inside a museum on this bright April morning. They are participating in a teacher-developed partnership with Cascadia Art Museum called Writing Art. Funded by the Foundation for Edmonds School District, the pilot program meets Federal guidelines for Common Core writing standards. Teachers reported a noticeable increase in engagement, participation and enthusiasm for writing.

Students wrote more, used more descriptive language and provided solid reasoning which demonstrated an understanding of opinion writing.





"One reason I like Highway in Oregon is color. I see light green, ghost white, sky blue, rose red, light brown, sunshine yellow, burnt black and gray cloud. Next, I really like the lines I see. A straight line, a long line and a square-ish line and they guide my eye down the road. And it makes me feel happy because it feels like I'm going on an apyencher [adventure]"

MEMORY CARE PROGRAM









We caught up recently with the Walkers and asked a few questions about their deep commitment to the arts and to Edmonds.

Q: Why is Edmonds a great art town?

T&M Walker: Because the people in Edmonds are supportive, appreciative and demonstrate their support by being enthusiastic volunteers

Q: What's it like to be on the ground floor as a donor to a new arts organization?

T&M Walker: In a word: exciting.

Q: What return on your investment in the arts do you wish to see? What defines success?

T&M Walker: Our contribution to the Museum is based upon our belief that a startup such as the Cascadia Art Museum needs early support so that it can show its value to the community. We made this contribution on faith in the people who conceived and birthed this wonderful organization. We were not thinking in terms of returns and have been very pleasantly surprised at the speed and breadth of the accomplishments. We are a bit in awe of what has been done this fast.

VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT:

Gentleman Jim Clark Volunteer Coordinator Extraordaire

"Back in February 2014 I learned about the plans to create a museum in Edmonds. I had been kicking around the house since I retired from my career as a VP of Operations in the electronics industry. This possibility piqued my interest as a great way for me to combine my expertise in logistics and working with people. I've always been interested in art. My father was an artist. Every family vacation was spent visiting galleries and museums.

I got in touch with the museum, and the next thing I knew I was recruited to help plan the museum's grand opening. Naturally it would be volunteer-driven, needing around 100 volunteers. We also thought we'd be really successful if a couple hundred people showed up. Surprisingly over 800 people visited the



museum on that opening weekend in September 2015! Volunteers did everything – marketing, meeting and greeting, offering tours, setting up, cleaning up, following up.

Now two plus years later, volunteers still power the museum: as volunteer docents, gallery attendants, museum store ambassadors, event support, etc. If the total number of donated hours were actual money, our volunteers would be the largest donors to the museum. I probably spend 20 hours or more a week scheduling and recruiting volunteers. I try to be creative, upbeat and diplomatic. My policy is not to ask anybody to do anything I wouldn't do myself. And I tell every volunteer that the working conditions are very good!"
