

Studio Cascadia

A learning studio for people of all ages

Form takes shape and gives it another dimension. This 3rd dimension creates a more realistic impression in contrast to the 'graphic' style seen in shape by depicting objects receding into the space. Think of a square becoming a cube for a house or a rectangle becoming a cylinder transformed into a vase for flowers.



Supply List:

- 6 1/2" x 6 1/2" white paper
- Pencil
- Ultra fine point sharpie
- 7 1/2" x 7 1/2" colored mounting paper
- Glue stick

Process:

Start with basic shapes like squares and ovals to create the doghouse, umbrella and flowerpots. Notice how the flowerpot, daffodil trumpet, water dish, umbrella and umbrella stand are all cylinders made from connecting two ovals. First start with pencil then go over all lines in sharpie, erasing any unwanted lines. Color and mount if desired.
