A learning studio for people of all ages

Shape can either be geometric and angular or curvy and organic. Either way shape emphasizes the flat two-dimensional property of elements in art.

Supply List:

- 9" x 4" white paper
- Ultra fine point sharpie
- Pencil
- 10" x 5" mounting paper
- Glue stick

Process:

Start this neighborhood by drawing in pencil with wavy lines creating a 'ground'. Then using flat two-dimensional shapes such as squares and rectangles to create the buildings and homes. Add circles and triangles for shrubbery and plants. Details like bricks, shutters, tiles, doors, window frames and moldings at excitement. Go over all pencil lines in sharpie erasing any unwanted lines. This project can be colored of left as a line drawing. Try this project along with the lesson on form to understand the differences between shape and form.
