



Studio Cascadia

A learning studio for people of all ages

Colors are thought of as warm, cool or neutral. Warm colors are 'sun' colors- red, yellow, orange, and purple and are thought to be lively and energetic. Cool colors are 'water' colors- blues and greens and bring calmness and tranquility to the scene. Neutrals like white and black help with value and contrast. This pear project features either a warm or cool pear with the opposite colored



background to define the difference between the two-color palettes.



Supply List:

- 6" x 6" pieces of white construction paper
- Variety of warm and cool colored pencils
- Ultra fine point sharpie
- Colored mounting paper
- Glue stick

Process:

Using a pencil make a small boarder all of the way around the paper. 2" from the bottom of the paper design a decorative ledge for the pear to sit on. Draw a pear by first making a large circle then placing a smaller circle on top. Loosely connect the two circles - erasing the inner parts. Add stem and leaf if desired. Note the small half circle where the stem goes into the pear! Now go over ALL lines with sharpie. Erase any unwanted pencil lines. Choose either a warm pear color- yellow, orange or red or a cool color pear color- green. Whichever color scheme you choose for the pear, choose the opposite for

the background and the same for the boarder. Red pear, cool background, warm boarder. Green pear, warm background, cool boarder.
