Education Intern

Cascadia Art Museum is starting a new school program called Cascadia Art for Schools in Fall 2020. We are seeking an intern who will help create program materials for this new program in collaboration with museum staff.

Learning Objectives:

The Education Intern will experience a part of the process in creating and implementing museum education programs, including research and selecting content, and creating standards-based art content for elementary school children.

About Cascadia Art for Schools

Cascadia Art for Schools (CAS) is a Washington state standards-based art program for K-8 students exploring the art of the Northwest. CAS is an interactive and inquiry-based tour, and students engage with art through facilitated dialogue, storytelling, and hands-on art creation. This program is learner-centered and explores artists that have been historically underrepresented. CAS has three components including a digital lesson, tour, and post-tour.

Intern Tasks:

- Create program materials including artist reference guides, history reference cards, historical timeline, and possible sample art projects.
- Help assemble Cascadia Care packages for schools.
- Expected time commitment: August through October, approximately 4 hours a week; remote work available.

Qualifications & Education:

- Minimum of a B.A. in progress
- Demonstrated interest in museum education, arts education, art history, and/or arts administration
- Basic typing and computer skills
- Basic design skills (InDesign)
- Ability to work with staff and volunteers in a professional manner and collaboratively
